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# General Overview

## Executive Summary

On March 11, 2021, the President of the United States signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to provide continued relief from the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. As part of ARPA, \$350 billion of State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) were allotted to assist governments in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic and its impacts on their communities. Anoka County was allotted just over \$69.3 million to assist its community in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic and its impacts. Under ARPA, the funds provided are planned to support Anoka County's community broadly in accordance with the U.S. Department of the Treasury guidelines by:

- Providing support for public health expenditures.
- Addressing negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency.
- Replacement of lost public sector revenue.
- Providing premium pay for essential workers.
- Investing in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure.

Anoka County recognizes the significant impact the COVID-19 pandemic has had within our community and is taking a very proactive approach in developing the uses for these funds that address the impact and serve all the county's residents:

- On August 24, 2021, the Anoka County Board of Commissioners, by resolution, officially accepted receipt of these funds pledging to follow the guidelines set forth by the U.S. Department of the Treasury.
- On August 24, 2021, the County Board, by resolution, established budget allocations for ARPA Funds in the following broad categories:
  - ✓ Public health - \$12 million.
  - ✓ Negative economic impact – to be determined.
  - ✓ Services to disproportionately impacted communities - to be determined.
  - ✓ Infrastructure - \$3.1 million.
  - ✓ Revenue replacement - \$18.6 million.
  - ✓ Grant administration - \$1 million.
  - ✓ Unallocated - \$35.1 million.

- On September 28, 2021, the County Board, by resolution, amended budget allocations for ARPA funds increasing the Public Health Category by \$7.3 million.
- On January 31, 2022, the County Board, by resolution, amended budget allocations for ARPA funds in the following broad categories:

  - ✓ Negative economic impact - \$4.2 million.

- On October 24, 2022, the County Board, by resolution, amended budget allocations for ARPA funds in the following broad categories:

  - ✓ Services to disproportionately impacted communities - \$2.2 million.
  - ✓ Infrastructure - \$8.5 million.
  - ✓ Revenue replacement - \$32.4 million.
  - ✓ Grant administration - \$1.0 million.
  - ✓ Unallocated - \$0.5 million.
- On Oct. 24, 2023, the County Board, by resolution, amended budget allocations for ARPA Funds in the following broad categories:
  - ✓ Public health - \$20.9 million.
  - ✓ Negative economic impact - \$4.3 million.
  - ✓ Services to disproportionately impacted communities - \$2.2 million.
  - ✓ Infrastructure - \$5.7 million.
  - ✓ Revenue replacement - \$34.5 million.
  - ✓ Grant administration - \$0.2 million.
  - ✓ Unallocated - \$2.0 million.

- On August 13, 2024, the County Board, by resolution, amended budget allocations for ARPA funds in the following broad categories:
  - ✓ Public health - \$21.1 million.
  - ✓ Negative economic impact - \$3.5 million.
  - ✓ Services to disproportionately impacted communities - \$2.2 million.
  - ✓ Infrastructure - \$2.3 million.
  - ✓ Revenue replacement - \$40 million.
  - ✓ Grant administration - \$0.2 million.
- Budget allocations will be adjusted by County Board resolution within the above categories as projects are identified and approved.
- The county administrator has developed an ARPA Governance Task Force that includes a cross-section of leaders from various departments throughout the county. This task force will meet as needed and review all requests prior to submission to the County Board for approval.
- Additionally, all projects will be vetted for compliance with ARPA guidelines prior to submission to the ARPA Governance Task Force by a compliance team, consisting of County Administration, Finance & Central Services, and the County Attorney's Office.

Anoka County has continued spending State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) on specific projects that were recognized and introduced under ARPA. As of June 30, 2025, a total of \$64.6 million has been spent on projects across the categories that were identified by the County Board as priorities intended for infrastructure and community outreach.

## Uses of Funds

The County Board, in an informational workshop, identified the following as initial priorities for consideration. All funds have been obligated.

### Public Health

Anoka County plans to designate funds to mitigate COVID-19 by supporting public health initiatives throughout the county. The County Board has allocated \$21.1 million for this category.

- Continuing support for healthcare costs related to the community and employees that have been directly impacted.

- Supporting community members and staff through needed facility modifications ensuring the prevention and mitigation of COVID-19.
- Enhancing behavioral and mental health care programs for both employees and citizens.
- Improving and redesigning the health and public programs that serve citizens.
- Addressing health disparities within our county.
- Meeting health needs of the community through usage of Cham Clinic.

### Negative Economic Impacts

Anoka County intends to address the negative economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic within the community as follows. The County Board has allocated \$3.5 million for this category.

- Assisting small business and non-profits with technical support resources.
- Aiding unemployed workers through our CareerForce Center.
- Addressing Park maintenance issues related to overuse from the community that has and continues to occur.
- Addressing public safety response to increased community violence.
- Addressing court service backlogs that are related to the pandemic.
- Aiding members of the community facing food insecurities via food shelves.

### Services to Disproportionately Impacted Communities

The County Board has allocated \$2.2 million for this category.

- Services and programs directed towards working with populations who are homeless.
- Development of community outreach programs, targeting mental health and other needs.
- Increased maintenance and updates to areas such as parks that serve impacted communities.
- Developing a strategic plan to identify and address community resources and economic development needs of the communities.

### Water, Sewer, and Broadband Infrastructure

The County Board has allocated \$2.3 million to provide a matching grant opportunity to our cities and township for projects that provide broadband expansion to unserved and underserved areas of our community.

- Bunker Hills Regional Park infrastructure.
- Enhanced public safety equipment.
- Broadband implementation and expansion for more modernized networks within the community.

## Revenue Replacement

Anoka County has suffered an economic loss due to the COVID-19 pandemic and intends to claim the lost revenue (in accordance with the Treasury guidance) and reinvest these funds back into the community. Anoka County's calculated revenue loss has exceeded the SLFRF allocation received of \$69.3 million.

### **Promoting equitable outcomes**

Ongoing ARPA funded projects are designed with a continued emphasis on promoting equitable outcomes for everyone in our community.

### **Community Engagement**

Anoka County recognizes it is vital that community feedback remain a central theme throughout this process and continues to consider additional methods for obtaining feedback throughout the performance period. Feedback was received by immigrant and nonprofit groups in 2022 that expressed insecurities within the community. As a result of the community feedback, the County Board provided financial support from the SLFRF funds to develop projects that directly benefited the communities impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

### **Labor Practices**

Projects for infrastructure will address labor practices within their plans as they are adopted and in accordance with U.S. Treasury Guidance.

### **Use of Evidence**

Projects in categories that require an evidence-based approach will be provided in the project plans during County Board adoption of the plan.
