| Background | In 2011 Anoka County developed a formal plan to assure compliance with the 2005 Federal Deficit Reduction Act (DRA). This Act requires Anoka County to educate our employees and contracted providers of Medical Assistance (MA) services on false claims laws and reporting requirements. Each year Anoka County must submit an Assurance Statement to the State of Minnesota confirming compliance with these mandates. As part of Anoka County's commitment, Human Services provides the County Board with an annual report summarizing key DRA-related activities from the prior year. | |

| Prior Action | <p>During calendar year 2025, Anoka County Human Services continued its work to meet the federal requirements under the Deficit Reduction Act (DRA) and maintain strong internal controls related to fraud prevention and reporting.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Anoka County Attorney's Office, Human Services Administration and Human Resources staff implemented a Workday-based DRA training for newly hired Human Services employees as part of onboarding.• All Human Services staff must complete an annual DRA refresher course and demonstrate understanding through a required assessment.• The DRA Compliance Manual is accessible to staff on the HS Administration SharePoint site.• Reportable DRA activity includes suspected MA fraud involving service providers or agencies.• In 2025, staff submitted 11 reports to the County's designated DRA chief compliance officer. Staff and contracted vendors may also report suspected fraud directly to the Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS).• The Department of Human Services (DHS) conducts investigations into suspected fraud or abuse involving DHS-funded programs. The same reporting mechanisms are available to the public.• While DHS reviews every report, not all reports result in an investigation or action. Investigation information is non-public, and DHS can only share outcomes once a case is resolved.• According to the DHS Medicaid Program Integrity webpage, there were 2,271 intakes statewide, of which 1,338 proceeded to open investigations. <p>March 2024: Staff provided an information Item to the Human Services Committee summarizing the prior year's annual report.</p> | |

| Background | <p>The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) is a federally funded program for low-income pregnant women, new mothers, babies and children up to 5 years of age who are found to be at nutrition risk. The WIC Program provides nutrition education, breastfeeding support, counseling, nutritious foods and referrals to health and other social services. The Anoka County Public Health & Environmental Services Department (PHES) has administered the WIC Program since 1978. The Peer Breastfeeding Support Program (PBSP) was initiated to supplement prenatal and postpartum breastfeeding support for pregnant and breastfeeding WIC participants, promoting a more positive breastfeeding experience and longer duration. Peer Counselors are women similar to the WIC participants they will work with and are trained to provide breastfeeding information and support to supplement other information provided by WIC staff. Anoka County PHES has administered the PBSP since 2010. PHES is required to submit a grant application to the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) for federal WIC and PBSP funding for the period January 1, 2027 - December 31, 2031. Grant applications must be submitted to MDH by April 17th, 2026.</p> <p>The WIC program has been shown to be a very beneficial and cost-effective program that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improves pregnancy outcomes (fewer low birth weight infants, fewer premature infants, lower infant mortality rates) • Decreases the number of anemic pregnant women, infants and children • Improves participation in prenatal and pediatric health care • Improves diet quality in children. <p>The PBSP has been shown to improve breastfeeding initiation and duration, particularly among minority populations. Some of the benefits of breastfeeding include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fewer infections and disease in infants • Higher IQ scores • Lower rates of obesity and diabetes later in life for breastfed infants • Lower rates of breast and ovarian cancers in women • Faster recovery from delivery for women <p>The current WIC funding for 10/1/25 – 9/30/26 is \$1,426,677 and the current Peer Breastfeeding Support Program funding for 10/1/25 – 9/30/26 is \$122,857.</p> |

| Background | <p>Anoka County received a four-year grant totaling \$1,100,000 from Minnesota Housing to administer the Homework Starts with Home (HSWH) program for the grant period October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2027. HSWH is funded through the Family Homeless Prevention and Assistance Program (FHPAP) and the Housing Trust Fund Subsidy and is operated in partnership with the Anoka-Hennepin School District. The program supports PreK through 12th grade students and unaccompanied youth experiencing or at risk of housing instability by providing rental assistance, deposits, and related stabilizing services.</p> <p>Of the total award, Anoka County received \$588,320 to contract with community providers for HSWH and FHPAP service delivery. The County currently contracts with The Salvation Army and the YMCA of the North to administer these programs. Metro HRA was awarded \$511,680 to administer the Housing Trust Fund subsidy program for HSWH participants residing in Anoka County.</p> <p>In 2026, additional funding from the Local Homeless Prevention Grant became available. This funding will allow contracted providers to expand staffing capacity and strengthen delivery of HSWH services. It will also provide the additional hours required to utilize twenty housing vouchers and increase the number of households served.</p> <p>Community Social Services and Behavioral Health, with recommendations from the FHPAP/HSWH Advisory Committee and support from the Heading Home Anoka Housing Collaborative, recommends approval of the following amendments to existing contracts, effective April 1, 2026:</p> <p><u>The Salvation Army Contract #C0010207</u> Amendment term: April 1, 2026 – September 30th, 2027 Previous Contract Maximum: \$399,500 Amended Contract Maximum: \$416,528</p> <p><u>YMCA of the North Contract #C0010208</u> Amendment term April 1, 2026 – September 30th, 2027 Previous Contract Maximum: \$166,628 Amended Contract Maximum: \$228,349</p> | |
