Yes

Mixed paper

- Mail, office & school papers
- Magazines & catalogs
- Newspapers & inserts
- Paper towel & toilet paper cores
- Phone books

Boxes

- Cardboard
- Cereal, cracker & pasta boxes
- Shoe, gift & electronics boxes
- Toiletry boxes
- Tissue boxes

No

- Food & grease soiled boxes
- Egg cartons
- Freezer boxes
- Paper towels, napkins, paper plates & cups
- Gift wrap & tissue
- Envelopes with bubble-wrap



Glass

Yes

- Beverage & food bottles & jars

No

- Drinking glasses, mugs, dishes, cook ware, pottery & vases
- Window & mirror glass
- Nail polish or hobby paint containers
- Light bulbs



Metal

Yes

- Beverage cans
- Food cans
- Aluminum foil, trays & pie tins

No

- Paint cans
- Aerosol cans
- Paint thinner or automotive fluid containers
- Scrap metal, such as cookware, nails & hangers



Cartons

Yes

- Milk cartons
- Juice cartons
- Juice boxes (straws removed)
- Soup, broth & wine cartons

No

- Ice cream cartons
- Egg cartons
- Plastic straws
- Foil drink pouches
- Take-out cartons



Plastic

Yes

Bottles & jugs Plastic #1, 2 & 5

- Water, soda & juice bottles
- Milk & juice jugs
- Ketchup & salad dressing bottles
- Shampoo, soap & lotion bottles
- Laundry containers

Cups, tubs & containers Plastic #1, 2 & 5

- Yogurt, pudding & fruit cups
- Clear plastic cups & produce containers
- Margarine, cottage cheese, cream cheese, other tubs & lids

Plastic #3, 4, 6 & 7

- Plastic bags
- Styrofoam® #6
- Automotive fluid & pesticide containers
- Black containers
- Utensils & straws

- Rinse food and beverage containers.
- Flatten boxes and remove packaging.

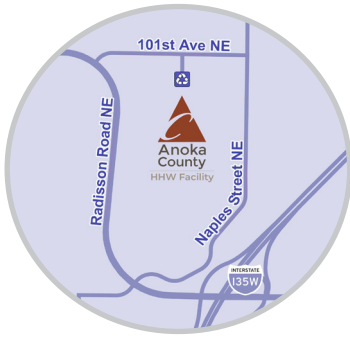
Household Hazardous Waste Facility

- Weed killer



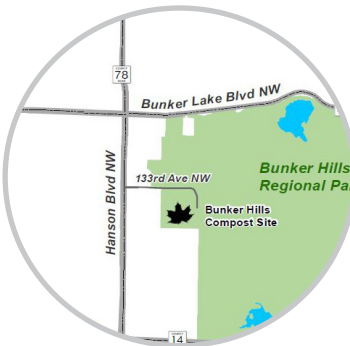

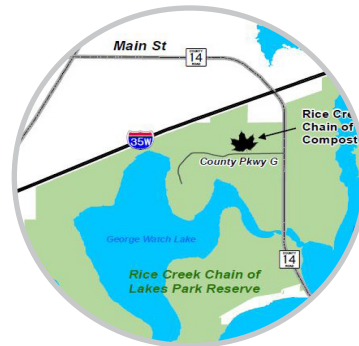


Anoka County has two compost sites which accept yard waste, tree waste and organics. All materials must be kept separate from each other because they are deposited in different areas. You're required to unload materials in the proper location and take empty bags and containers with you. **Closed major holidays and during severe weather.**

- Yard Waste**
 debagged leaves, grass, weeds, and soft plant materials
- Tree Waste**
 shrub and tree trimmings, logs, stumps and wood chips
- Organics**
 food scraps, uncoated paper, BPI certified compostable products
