

# Ongoing Training Requirements for Licensed Providers and Second Adult Caregivers

Per MN Statutes 142B.70

---

**16 hours of annual training is required each year and must include:**

- Child Development and Learning and Behavior Guidance (every year):  
KCF I or IIC (two hours each year or completion of a 3-credit course about early childhood development)
- Active Supervision or Health & Safety (two hours each year – note:  
Health & Safety I and II must be taken every five years)
- Pediatric CPR (every two years and 90 days)
- Pediatric First Aid (every two years and 90 days)
- SUID (every two years, videos on the off year)
- AHT (every two years, videos on the off year)
- Basic Education for Safe Travel (if transporting, every five years)

**For training hours to be approved the course must focus on one or more of the training subjects outlined in MN Statutes 142B.70:**

Ongoing training subjects shall be selected from the following areas:

1. Child Growth and Development
2. Learning Environment and Curriculum
3. Assessment and Planning for Individual Needs
4. Interaction with Children
5. Families and Communities
6. Health, Safety, and Nutrition
7. Program Planning and Evaluation
8. Behavior Guidance
9. Cultural Dynamics

County licensing staff will accept training approved by the Minnesota Center for Professional Development, including:

1. Face-to-face classroom training
2. Online training
3. Relationship-based professional development, such as mentoring, coaching, and consulting
